Legacy of Faith Hew St. Mary's is building on their 100 year-old history to secure their future.

We remember the first time we visited St. Mary's and met Father Louis Bellopede. How could we not? He exudes positive energy and kindness wherever he goes. He's also extremely committed to his parish community, and it shows. Currently the pastor of St. Mary's in Schwenksville, Fr. Bellopede reached out to us to discuss the needs of his aging parish. At 100 years old, St. Mary's needed pertinent restoration. Their dome-style roof was leaking, parts of the exterior were deteriorating, and conditions were becoming unsafe for parishioners.

Together with the help of CFGP's Mission Advancement Services (MAS) Team, St. Mary's conducted a feasibility study to determine if a capital campaign to help restore their spiritual home was possible. The results determined that a capital campaign was worthwhile. The campaign goal was set at \$2 million over a pledged 4 years. St. Mary's Legacy of Faith Campaign officially kicked off on May 1, 2019.



St. Mary's to reach their goal, but their campaign has already reached \$1.89 million! We could not be more thrilled for Fr. Bellopede and his parish community.

While St. Mary's parishioners and staff were optimistic they could raise a sufficient amount for their church, even they have been blown away by just how much generosity and support they've garnered. With their goal almost met, the St. Mary's community has surpassed their own expectations, illustrating the love they share for their parish and their faith.
